



Wet Tropics Waterways

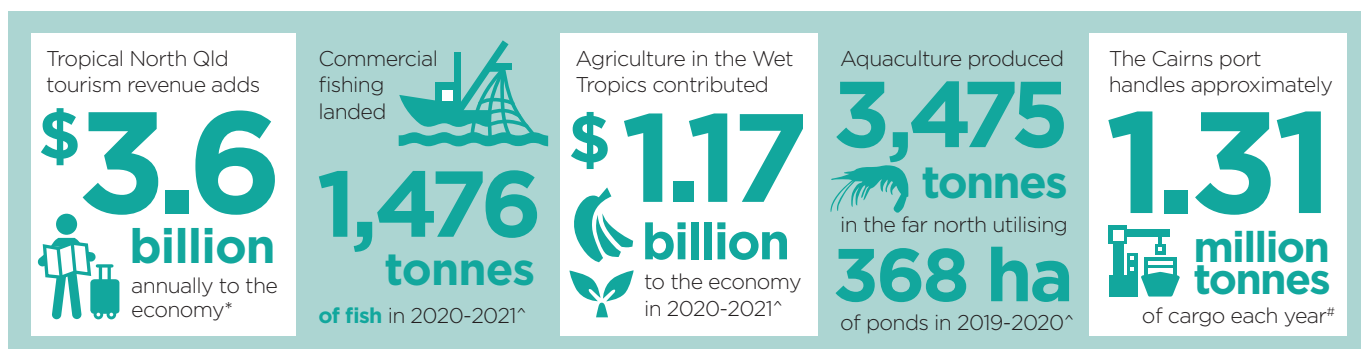

What we do

- Monitor the health of our waterways and promote waterway health projects in our region.
- Provide a bridge between science, government, industry and the wider community.
- Provide trusted and independent information on waterway health for the Wet Tropics.
- Provide opportunities to connect, network and share knowledge with organisations and individuals with an interest in waterway health.
- Provide and communicate data for researchers, managers and the wider community to contribute to a greater understanding of our waterways.
- Produce an annual report card that assesses the condition of waterway health in the Wet Tropics.
